He feels that in addition to pursuing his professional goals, he is in a position to help and inspire people who "feel powerless to act in the face of ordinary obstacles," and to help them more fully realize their own power and strength.

Kaitlyn Fisher Recipient of a \$750 Scholarship

Kaitlyn is pursuing her Master of Social Work at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania. She was born with Spinal Muscular Atrophy. She uses a power wheelchair full time, and needs assistance with all the daily life activities on our application except for breathing, communicating, seeing and hearing. Kaitlyn received her Bachelor's Degree in Criminal Justice from Edinboro, and comes highly recommended by her professors and by her supervisors at the Erie County Crime Victims' Center, where she did an internship. As an undergraduate, she was co-president of the Criminal Justice Club and a member of Alpha Phi Sigma, the National Criminal Justice Honor Society. She says, "All my life, I have wanted to become someone whose job was to help others." With her MSW, she plans to pursue a career as a medical social worker, either in a pediatrics unit or emergency room of a hospital.
